


# B/J 17



The BJ 17 is a fine example of a classic form developed in the early 1800's. Originally it was designed for use as a workboat off Whitehall Street in New York Harbor. Their reputation for sea worthiness and ease of handling is legendary. The BJ 17, originally a "Whitehall Pulling Boat," was designed by Gary W. Mull using data from Howard Chapelle and the Smithsonian Institute.
