


# Buccaneer: designed to work; built to last



When you know what goes into each Buccaneer, you'll know why anything else is second best.

We start with the right designs, drawing upon the talents of our own staff and of world famous people like Bill Garden and others, to create boats that meet rigid performance and comfort requirements. Throughout the exacting process from drawing board to sea trials, each boat is constantly tested and evaluated, so we're sure it's right before it goes into production.

Throughout the building process, we use the finest materials possible; from gel coat to upholstery fabric, everything is specified for high strength, low maintenance and long life... all this to give you years of enjoyable sailing, and a higher return on your investment.

Buccaneer hull and deck components are all laidup by hand, using several alternating layers of strand and woven roving, overlapped at stress points for maximum strength where it counts. This unique process bonds the roving layers into a tightly integrated unit. After the basic layup, each hull is further strengthened, depending on model, by sealed wood stringers, score foam laminate and marine grade plywood. Cabin tops and decks are stiffened with plywood or end-grain balsa core. Hull and deck are joined with stout fastenings every six inches and permanently sealed and reinforced.

All deck hardware is top quality, specified for strength. Permanently anchored in place, they're through-bolted to buttblocks and bedded in sealant.

Windows, portlights and hatch covers are made of tempered glass and heavy grade plex; lifelines and stanchions are the toughest available, because they have to be. And for secure footing on board, non-skid surfacing is molded into decks, so it won't peel or wear off.

To insure absolute quality control, most components are fabricated in-house: all upholstery work, dodgers, wiring systems, cabinetry and jointer work are done by Buccaneer to Buccaneer's specifications—not someone else's. So you get a boat that goes together right, works right and lasts a long, long time.

There's no better way to build boats; to us, it's the only way. Because we know you won't come back a second time for second best.





Yet perhaps most surprising is that it's fully equipped for long-range cruising, with standard diesel power and a host of amenities you wouldn't expect to find on a world-class racer.

The 335 is supremely comfortable and delightfully easy to sail. Strong? It's built for offshore racing, so it'll take whatever your kind of cruising dishes out.



The spacious interior is positively loaded with homelike comforts, richly appointed with teak and warm fabrics, and arranged to give you the best possible use of available space.

The 305's performance proves that cruising boats can also be fast. Tall rig, long waterline and fine entry provide excellent performance to weather, and the long-run keel gives you straight tracking, even under spinnaker. The 48 inch draft allows you to sneak into quiet coves where others can't. Standard diesel power gets you where you're going—and back—weather or not.

All cruisers and racers are equipped with winches, blocks, genoa tracks, mainsheet traveler—complete standing and running rigging. No fewer than four models feature diesel auxiliary power as standard equipment.

Lifelines and bow pulpits are standard on all models from the 220 and up, and for an extra measure of security, you'll find stout grab rails everywhere you need them.

A glance at each model's standard equipment list tells you boats are just as complete below decks. Bunk cushions are standard on all cruisers, as are lights, cabin windows and ventilating hatches. Many models feature complete galley, head, shower and much more...everything you'd expect to find on a great boat. And then some.




