



Why sail a Butterfly?

Because it's designed to do so many things so well. Large enough to accommodate several people. Fast enough for serious competition. Light enough for launching by one person. And virtually maintenance free.

You sail "dry"

The generous beam, combined with 15-inch depth, keeps the boat quite dry and gives her additional capacity. And a spray rail across the deck helps keep water out of the footwell.

You sail secure

In case you capsize, the Butterfly is swamp-proof since the footwell is molded into the deck, forming a completely airtight sealed hull. Then, for added security there is enough foam inside the hull to float boat and crew.

You sail comfortably

The deep footwell measures a roomy 25 x 15 inches. And mahogany handrails not only add classic beauty, but a secure hand and toe grip.

You sail anywhere

Whether you tow it on a small trailer, or carry it on the top of your car, with the Butterfly you can quickly get to the water, ready to launch.

You sail with quality

Owners appreciate the quality of the Butterfly. Extreme attention to every detail, from the quality glass finish to the hand-rubbed varnished woodwork, assures that the Butterfly is a boat the most discriminating sailor will be proud to own.



You sail in "class"

The Butterfly is a nationally established one-design class, governed by the National Butterfly Association. Both Single-Handed and Doubles National Regattas are held annually, plus plenty of local and regional events, sponsored by dozens of fleets across the country. Even if competition is not your goal, you'll find Butterfly is a challenging and exciting boat to sail.

You sail easily

Easy handling and stability make the Butterfly ideal for young sailors. Many yacht clubs and camps use it as their junior training boat. With its large capacity and ample seating, it's also a boat the entire family can enjoy together.

Construction

Internal fiberglass stiffeners and supports • Hull and deck bonded together to form a unit • Foam flotation • Stainless steel and aluminum alloy hardware • Stainless steel machine screw fasteners • Aluminum backing plates • Philippine mahogany tiller • Hiking stick • Anodized aluminum rotating mast and boom • Stainless steel aircraft cable rigging • Dacron halyard and sheet line • High quality blocks • 3.8 oz. dacron racing quality sail • Adjustable daggerboard snubber • Spray rail • Two-piece mast.

Boom Vang optional

Marconi rig drives the boat fast, allows it to point close. Sail raises and lowers easily without removing mast.

Two-piece mast rotates for proper bend and perfect air foil.

Vinyl rub rail protects against scuffing.

Spring-loaded kick-up aluminum rudder stays up when you launch, down when you sail.
