

The Cape Dory Typhoon, "America's littlest Yacht", is one of the most popular sailboats ever built. There are more than 1,750 sailing from mountain lakes in the Rockies to the blue waters of the Atlantic, Pacific, and Caribbean. There is a good reason for her popularity: The Typhoon is a joy to sail for beginner and expert alike.

Her full keel with 900 lbs. of molded internal ballast gives the Typhoon the feel of a larger boat, with a steadiness and stability not found in lighter designs.

There are two Typhoon models: The Daysailer features a deep roomy cockpit with teak seats and a cuddy cabin for stowage of gear. Her sister, The Weekender has a fully enclosed cabin with four berths. There is room for portable toilet, stove, and ice chest when cruising.

Each is complete, from cradle to sails. Both Typhoons are built to the quality standard that trademarks all Cape Dory boats. They are a sight to be remembered when under sail.
