



CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

CORONADO 15 CLASS RACING ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I - OBJECTIVE

The objective of the CORONADO 15 Class Racing Association, hereinafter referred to as the Association, is to promote CORONADO 15 Class racing under uniform rules and regulations, and to maintain the one-design features of the CORONADO 15 Class Sloop.

ARTICLE II - POLICY

1. To cooperate with other yachting organizations, and in return, to insist on strict observance and compliance with the rules of the Association.
2. To keep the cost of acquisition and upkeep of CORONADO 15 Class sloops within modest limits without sacrificing high standards of performance and seaworthiness.
3. To promote and maintain a one-design class of CORONADO 15 sloops in order that racing shall determine the skill of skipper and crew under uniform rules and specifications.

ARTICLE III - JURISDICTION

1. The Association has jurisdiction over all CORONADO 15 Class activities. Its By-Laws and rules govern all CORONADO 15 Class races, regardless of sponsor and are binding upon all members and fleets.
2. Permission must be obtained from the Association prior to eliminating or deviating from any requirement of the Constitution and By-Laws in racing a CORONADO 15 Class Sloop.
3. All events involving racing within the territorial waters of a Fleet shall be sanctioned by that Fleet through its elected officers.
4. All disputes between Fleets, or a Fleet and other yachting organizations, regarding the interpretations of the Constitution and By-Laws shall be resolved by the Board of Directors of the Association, and its decision shall be final.

5. The Association shall not be liable for any debts contracted by its officers, Fleet officers, or members, other than the expenditures authorized by the budget or upon written order of the Commodore and Treasurer.

6. The Association reserves the right to declare ineligible any sloop which does not conform to the SPIRIT as well as the letter of these rules, and the specifications and drawings of the CORONADO 15.

ARTICLE IV - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

1. The Board of Directors of this corporation, hereinafter referred to as the Board, shall consist of all Flag Officers, the Junior Staff Commodore, the District Secretaries, and the other directors specified in Article V, and shall serve for a term as specified therein.

2. For purposes of doing business, a Quorum shall consist of a majority of the Board, excluding the District Secretaries.

3. The Board shall conduct all business, determine policy of the Association, and shall serve as the last court of appeal in disputes involving these By-Laws.

4. The Board has the authority to enforce its decisions by suspension of entire Fleets or individual members. The Board may sanction or ban races, grant or revoke Fleet Charters, and suspend members guilty of gross violation of rules or unsportsmanlike conduct. Its rulings shall be binding and final. A 3/4 majority vote shall decide all issues.

ARTICLE V - FLAG OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

1. Flag Officers

(a) Commodore - The Commodore is the Chief Executive. He shall preside at meetings, serve as Chairman of the Board, rule on procedure and jurisdiction, summarize decisions, appoint Directors and special committees, and authorize payment of all bills with approval of the Board.

(b) Vice-Commodore - The Vice Commodore shall officiate in the absence of the Commodore and is in charge of the Class National Championship Regatta.

(c) Rear Commodore - The Rear Commodore shall officiate in the absence of the Commodore or Vice Commodore, and shall coordinate Class development programs.

(d) Secretary - The Secretary shall handle all correspondence, retain the minutes of meetings, and maintain an accurate and current record of members, Fleets and Fleet Officers. He shall notify the membership of special events, decisions affecting policy, banned races, suspended members and/or Fleets, and ineligible CORONADO 15 Class sloops.

(e) Treasurer - The Treasurer shall be responsible for protection and custody of cash receipts, financial disbursements as approved by the Board, maintaining financial records, and financial reporting at meetings.

2. Directors

(a) Measurement Chairman - The Measurement Chairman shall be in charge of all certified measures both on the Measurement Committee and at the Class National Championship Regatta. He shall grant or reject all measurement certificates, issue duplicates, and answer all questions from Fleet Measurers regarding measurement rules. He shall interpret the rules and regulations on matters not specifically covered in the official plans and specifications. Such rulings shall be subject to approval of the Board. The measurement Chairman shall not approve changes in construction specifications, sail plan, or rigging. Rulings of the Measurement Chairman, approved by the Board, shall be included in an annual report of the Measurement Chairman.

(b) Rules Chairman - There shall be a Rules Chairman who shall evaluate and make recommendations to the Board regarding changes in the Constitution and By-Laws of the Association deemed necessary to improve the clarity or fairness of any rules or amendment.

(c) Publicity Chairman - The Publicity Chairman shall publish the Association news letter and report news to external publishers.

(d) Race Chairman - The Race Chairman shall schedule recommended events for Association attendance.

(e) Honorary Director - In recognition of F. W. Butler's outstanding services to the Coronado 15 Class, he shall hold the office of Honorary Director permanently. He may make and second motions, but shall not vote and shall not be counted in determining a quorum.

3. All Flag Officers shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Association for a term commencing with such annual meeting and expiring at the conclusion of the next annual meeting. Each shall be nominated, seconded, and voted upon separately by the fleet delegates in the order named. Candidates shall be presented by the Junior Staff Commodore who will be chairman of a Nominating Committee consisting of himself and at least two other Staff Commodores.

ARTICLE VI - DISTRICT OFFICERS

1. District Secretary - The District Secretary shall be a member of the Board and shall have general supervision over all Association activities in the District. He shall coordinate policy and decisions of the Board with each Fleet in the District.

2. Alternate District Secretary - The Alternate District Secretary shall officiate during any prolonged absence of the District Secretary. Should the office of District Secretary become vacated, the Alternate District Secretary shall become District Secretary for the remainder of the term.

3. The District Secretary shall be elected by the members through a mail vote of the Fleets. The election must be held in advance of the Annual Meeting of the Association. The person receiving the greatest number of votes shall serve during the ensuing year. The person receiving the second greatest number of votes shall be the Alternate District Secretary.

ARTICLE VII - MEETINGS

1. The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held during the period of, and in the vicinity of, the Class National Championship Regatta. Special meetings by order of the Board, or upon demand in writing by twenty-five percent (25%) of the Fleets, must be held. Time and place of all meetings shall be fixed by the Board.

(a) Notice of a meeting shall be sent to the last recorded Secretary of each Fleet in time to permit action by delegate or proxy. If it is a Special Meeting, the purpose thereof must be plainly stated in such form as to permit voting by mail. No business other than that stated may be transacted at a Special Meeting.

(b) One-half of the Fleets in good standing shall constitute a quorum at meetings. If a quorum exists at Roll Call, it exists throughout the session of the meeting.

(c) The membership of each Fleet shall select and instruct a delegate. If unable to send a delegate, the Fleet shall sign and deliver to the Secretary of the Association, a duly authorized proxy to present the Fleet's views and cast its votes at the meeting.

(d) Any number of alternates or proxies may be named, but the first in order present shall be the only one entitled to cast the Fleet's votes. Only those alternate or proxies properly certified in writing by the proper Fleet Officers will be recognized.

(e) Each Fleet shall be entitled to cast one vote for each CORONADO 15 Class Sloop enrolled in that Fleet, which has been properly recorded with the Association by an active member in good standing. No Fleet is entitled to more than thirty-three and one-third percent (33 1/3%) of the total number of votes cast. No more than one vote shall be allowed for any one member, no matter how many CORONADO 15 Class Sloops he may own. Membership books close thirty (30) days before any meeting, or as ordered by the Board.

(f) Members may be heard, but only accredited delegates, proxies, alternates, and detached members shall vote on motions. All Fleet delegates or detached members must vote or be recorded as abstaining on each motion unless excused by the Chairman of the Meeting. A majority of votes cast shall decide all questions not otherwise stipulated, and the Chair shall cast the one deciding vote in case of a tie and may also fix a time limit on speakers and debate of motions.

2. The order of business at the Annual Meeting shall be:

1. Call to Order
2. Roll Call of Fleets - Certification of Quorum.
3. Minutes of Last Meeting.
4. Reports of Executive Officers.
5. Reports of Charters Granted and Revoked.
6. Ratification of Governing Board Rulings.
7. Unfinished Business.
8. New Business.
9. Election of Officers.
10. Adjournment.

ARTICLE VIII - DUES

1. Both the Association and Fleet dues must be paid before any member can be considered in good standing. Paying of dues, on or before the required date, shall be the sole responsibility of each individual member. Fleet secretaries shall collect Fleet and Association dues, forwarding the Association dues to the Association Secretary. The Association annual dues become due and payable on January 31.

2. The annual dues of the Association shall be five dollars (\$5.00) per member.

ARTICLE IX - SANCTIONED EVENTS

1. All series or races for CORONADO 15 Class National Championships Regattas territorially greater than one Fleet, or events for Perpetual, semi-Perpetual or Open trophies, must be sanctioned in writing to the sponsoring organization by the Fleet in whose waters the event is held.

2. The method of determining qualifications to enter the Class National Championship Regatta shall be established by the Board. Fleet members, representing a Fleet Quota, must be authorized as eligible to compete by that Fleet.

3. The Class National Championship Regatta shall be held in August.

4. There may be two (2) winners in Class (National or Fleet) Championships: "A" Division and "B" Division.

5. The CORONADO 15 Class National Championship trophies ("F. W. Butler Perpetual Trophy" for Class "A" Division and "Jean Butler Perpetual Trophy" for Class "B" Division) may be retained for the ensuing year at the winner's yacht clubs. The trophies shall be returned to the Association at least thirty (30) days prior to the first race of the Class Championship Regatta.

ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS

1. The Constitution and By-Laws may never be suspended but may be amended at an Association meeting by a fifty-one percent (51%) majority vote of all paid members in good standing through their proxies or Fleet delegates at the meeting.

(a) All proposed amendments to be voted on at either Annual Meetings or Special Meetings must be included in a notice of the meeting which shall be mailed to the general membership not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of the meeting.

(b) Proposed amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws shall be submitted to the Board.

2. In addition to the foregoing method of amendment, the Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by the written consent of the majority of the members of this Association to amendment proposed by the Board or by consent of fleets representing the majority of members. Fleets shall give such consent only upon vote of members at a meeting thereof or written consent of a majority of the Fleet.

ARTICLE XI - FLEETS

1. A Fleet is a territorial unit open to all eligible persons who sail within its area. It elects its own officers, which must include a Fleet Secretary. The Fleet is self-governing in all local matters not conflicting with the CORONADO 15 Class Constitution and By-Laws, and has the authority to accept or reject application for Fleet membership.

2. At the option of the Fleet it may be divided into Class "A" and Class "B" Divisions in an attempt to equalize performance based upon skill or equipment used.

3. A new Fleet may be granted a charter upon application to the Board by owners of three (3) or more boats, who must be members of the Association.

4. Each Fleet is required to file an Annual Report of membership with the Association during June of each year to renew its rights and privileges under the Charter.

5. Fleet Charters may be granted, suspended or altered by the Board, but revoked only at an Annual Meeting. Reasons for suspension are:

(a) Failure to maintain in good standing, the minimum membership quota of CORONADO 15 Class Sloops.

(b) Failure to file an annual report of Fleet members with the Association by July 1.

(c) Failure to comply with these By-Laws knowingly or otherwise.

6. Suspended Fleets, members and ineligible sloops shall be posted by publication, and shall be barred from all CORONADO 15 Class races and activities. They cannot be reinstated until requirements of the Association have been fulfilled. Suspension of a Fleet suspends its members. Upon payment of unpaid dues by a Fleet dropped or suspended only for non-payment of dues, such fleet shall be reinstated.

7. Each Fleet shall hold an annual meeting not later than June 15 of each year for the purpose of electing Fleet Officers. The results of the election shall be filed with the Association not later than two (2) weeks after said election.

8. The amount and time of payment of Fleet dues shall be fixed by each Fleet.

9. No member may be suspended from a Fleet except by a majority vote of the Fleet.

ARTICLE XII - MEMBERSHIP

1. The membership of the Association and of its Fleets shall consist of two grades: Regular and Associate. Membership grades are defined as follows:

(a) Regular Member: The owner or part owner of a properly certified and registered CORONADO 15 Class Sloop. He must be a member of a Fleet if in an area where there are three or more CORONADO 15 Class Sloops which can practically race together. Membership shall be retained until the end of the calendar year in which the member ceases to be a CORONADO 15 owner. Only Regular Members in good standing are privileged to vote and hold office in accordance with the By-Laws.

(b) Associate Member: A non-CORONADO 15 boat owner who is interested in the promotion of the Association. An Associate Member may not vote or hold office.

2. A member, while in good standing of this Association, shall be eligible to race in any Association sanctioned race.

3. Any member may be expelled from the Association only by three-quarters (3/4) vote at an Annual Meeting.

4. New applicants for membership shall not be considered eligible to race in the CORONADO 15 Class until all measurements, registration, and paid up dues are recorded by the Fleet to which he belongs, if one exists, and the Association.

5. Members who are delinquent in either their Fleet or Association dues shall be ineligible and disqualified from racing until the dues are paid.

6. When a member ceases to be a CORONADO 15 Class Sloop owner his membership shall be retained, along with this racing eligibility, until the end of the calendar period when his dues are payable again.

7. A member may not belong to more than one CORONADO 15 Fleet at one time, nor may a CORONADO 15 Class Sloop be registered in more than one CORONADO 15 Fleet at one time.

ARTICLE XIII - RACING RULES

1. A CORONADO 15 Class Sloop shall be sailed by the same skipper in each race of a series of races in which it participates. The skipper and helmsman shall be one and the same person except for normal periods of relief. The skipper shall be a member or dependent of a member of this Association.
2. The minimum number of persons racing in a CORONADO 15 Class Sloop shall be two (2).
3. Every race in a regatta of races must be completed with the same number of crew aboard as started in the first race of such series. Children under age eight cannot be considered crew.
4. The total minimum crew weight shall be 300 pounds for all races. Loose ballast (other than normal equipment) shall be added to attain this when minimum crew weight is not reached. The ballast shall not be relocated during a race.
5. All boats racing in the National Championship Regatta must be certified as to total crew weight at the regatta site prior to racing. Any alternate crew must also be weighed and certified.
6. Standing rigging lengths and position may not be adjusted during a race.
7. No hiking aids other than deck mounted hiking straps are permitted except as listed in Article XVI, Section 10.
8. Mast foot may not be moved during a race.
9. Jib tack must be kept less than 3" above the deck.
10. There must be a Coast Guard approved cushion or preserver for each person aboard.
11. Buoyance - There shall be no uncovered holes from the outer hull into the inner hull.

ARTICLE XIV - ELIGIBLE SLOOPS

1. A sloop is eligible to race in the CORONADO 15 Class only if it:

(a) Conforms to measurement specifications and rules as certified by an Association "Official Certificate of Measurement" form, that has been signed by the Fleet Measurer, or by his proxies, the Measurement Chairman, and the Association Secretary.

(b) Is owned by a paid up member of the Association.

(c) Has current Association decal located on the transom. The decal indicates that both (a) and (b) above are satisfied and is issued annually through the Fleet or Association Secretary. It shall be the responsibility of all members of the Association to assure that entrants in CORONADO 15 Class events are eligible to race.

2. An ineligible yacht may be protested at any time: before the first race, between races, or after all races are completed. No special dispensation of eligibility may be granted by an individual or organization to a yacht sailing in the CORONADO 15 Class without prior written approval from Fleet Officers for a Fleet activity, or from the Board for national activities.

Racing an ineligible yacht may be cause for suspension from both the Fleet and Association.

ARTICLE XV - MEASUREMENT CERTIFICATES

1. The Association's "official Certificate of Measurement", as issued by the Measurement Chairman, shall be binding upon all organizations conducting races for the CORONADO 15 Class. A yacht holding a valid measurement certificate signed by the Fleet Measurer or his proxies as witnessing the measurements, the Measurement Chairman as accepting these measurements, and the Association Secretary as officially registering the certificate under that owner, shall not be subject to measurement or protest on measurement unless reasonable evidence of subsequent alterations can be shown.

2. Fleet Measurers shall restrict their authority to the actual measurements and recording of measurements on the "Official Certificate of Measurement". Controversial changes, or changes that affect sailing characteristics, must be referred to the Measurement Chairman for evaluation and presentation to the Board. Fleet Measurers shall not measure their own boat except under the supervision of a disinterested Fleet or Association Officer.

ARTICLE XVI SPECIFICATIONS

1. General

- (a) It shall be illegal to produce a mold of the CORONADO 15 Class sloop without specific permission and approval of the Board.
- (b) All changes of the CORONADO 15 Class sloop, unless specified herein, require approval of the Association. Yachts incorporating changes may be declared ineligible for racing and membership in the Association.
- (c) Numbers corresponding with the racing number of the main sail shall be permanently affixed to the hull. These numbers shall be issued only by the Association.
- (d) All measurements, equipment, and characteristics of the CORONADO 15 Class sloop shall comply with details listed and described in the specifications and plans.

2. Rudder, Centerboard and Tiller

Rudder may be fixed or beaching type. Rudder and centerboard must conform to the shape on the official plan. Rudder, centerboard and tiller must be made of solid wood and may be fiberglass covered. No hollow or foam filled sections allowed. Unless otherwise specified, all dimensions are $\pm 1/4"$.

(a) Rudder Specifications

Width: $10" \pm 1/4"$

Length: $21 \frac{1}{2} " \pm 1/2"$ from bottom of boat while racing.

Thickness: $3/4"$ plus $1/8"$ or minus $1/8"$ continuous from top to within $4"$ of bottom. The thickness measurement shall be taken at the thickest point between the leading and trailing edges.

(b) Centerboard Specifications

Width: $13 \frac{1}{2} " \pm 1/4"$

Length: $42" \pm 1/2"$ from bottom of boat.

Thickness: $13/16"$ plus or minus $1/8"$ continuous from top to within $4"$ of bottom. The thickness measurement shall be taken at the thickest point between the leading and trailing edges.

Jibing Limitations: The lateral or athwartships movement at the leading edge of the centerboard shall not be greater than $1/4"$ more than the trailing edge.

Leading Edge:

Location: The intersection of the centerboard in the full down position and the hull shall be between 100 1/8" and 101 3/4" from the transom as measured along the hull bottom. Temporary adjustment of this position is not allowed.

Rake: The leading edge of the centerboard in the full down position shall not extend forward of a line perpendicular to the hull.

3. Mast

(a) The mast shall be non-rotating. It shall be a non-tapering extrusion of aluminum with basic dimensions of 2.25 x 2.94 x 0.08 inches; weight 0.852 lbs. per foot. (Die No. HSO-5087 - Wesco Marine) The length of the mast shall be 22 feet 10 \pm 1/2 inches, excluding the top and bottom fitting. The standard bottom fitting must be used. No change shall be made to the mast extrusion for the purpose of increasing bending.

(b) A mast partner may be installed in the boat for the purpose of limiting forward or athwartships mast movement only.

4. Boom

Straight aluminum extrusion with basic dimensions of 2.00 x 2.50 x 0.08 inches; weight 0.682 lbs. per foot. (Die No. HSO-5076 - Wesco Marine) No changes shall be made to the boom extrusion for the purpose of increased bending.

5. Mainsheet Arrangement

The mainsheet shall be led from a midship traveler (1" straight stainless steel tube) or from a fixed post on the deck.

6. Spreaders

- (a) Length: 16 1/4" minimum length (mast to shroud).
- (b) Spreaders may be fixed or pivoting. (Refer to plan for location)
- (c) Material used and shape of spreaders is optional.

7. Weight of Hull and Equipment

The minimum weight shall be 385 pounds and shall include the hull, hoist sling, centerboard, rudder, tiller and tiller extension, permanently installed equipment, mast, boom, all rigging, but shall not include sails, whisker pole, cushions, and other equipment. Ballast required to meet the minimum weight shall be affixed to the boat. Half of added ballast shall be placed on the keelson in the forward compartment and half on the upper inside of the compartment. Any other location of weight is permissible if the center of gravity is not lowered and the weight is distributed as much as practical. Measurers shall place upon the certificates for boats measured a statement of the weight of ballast required.

8. Sails

(a) Insignia and Numbers: Mainsails shall be marked with the CORONADO 15 Class Insignia: top triangle red, bottom triangle blue; triangle line width 1"; equilateral triangles 16" maximum width and 12" on vertical; letter C and number 3 1/2" wide, 4 1/2" high, line width 1". Position of emblem: center between 1st and 2nd battens (back to back). Letters "US" (10") and sail numbers (10") shall be located between the second and bottom two battens.

Upon winning the Class Championship, a gold chevron, approximately six inches (6") in length, may be added to the sail between the leech of the sail and the Class emblem, with the year below. The CORONADO 15 Class Racing Association will bear the cost of adding the gold chevron. This honor is made to the skipper, and not the boat, and shall be retained by the skipper for use on any CORONADO 15 Class sloop he may own while still a member of the Association.

Each Fleet may designate a Class "A" Division Fleet Champion by the award of a blue chevron, and a Class "B" Division Champion by a red chevron. The blue chevron will be used when Divisions are not established.

(b) Rules for Both Sails: All sails shall be stamped on the tack of the sail by the Fleet Measurer with a miniature replica of the CORONADO 15 Class Insignia. The Fleet Measurer shall include, within the insignia, his initials and the date sails were measured.

The Measurement Chairman shall issue these stamps to all certified Fleet Measurers. Sails not stamped with the Official ("C-15") stamp, dated and signed by the Fleet Measurer, shall be considered illegal and shall disqualify the boat from racing eligibility. Sails shall be measured and stamped by the Fleet Measurer prior to use in any regatta.

The purchase and/or use of additional sails by CORONADO 15 Class sloop owners shall be limited to one jib and one main sail in any calendar year since purchase of the boat, except that one additional jib and one main may be purchased for any yacht during its first sailing season.

(c) Measurement Procedure for Sails: The jib luff shall be measured from the extreme top of the sail to the extreme edge of the tack excluding the thimbles. The foot shall be measured from the extreme edge of the clew to the extreme edge of the tack, excluding the thimble. The "extreme edge" of the tack or clew is defined as the intersection of the cloth.


The luff of the jib shall be subject to a direct line pull sufficient to remove all wrinkles while it is being measured, and the leech and foot shall be subject to a direct line pull with only that tension applied necessary to remove all wrinkles. The main sail leech shall be subject to a direct line pull with only that tension applied to remove all wrinkles. The mid-girth of both jib and main shall be subject to a direct line pull with only that tension applied to remove all wrinkles.

9. Whisker Pole


- (a) By definition in NAYRU a whisker pole is a spinnaker pole.
- (b) The whisker pole must be in contact with the mast at all times during use.
- (c) The whisker pole may be made of any material and may use any type of fittings including a yoke.
- (d) The maximum distance between the closest parts of the mast and the jib clew shall be 96" with the whisker pole connecting them.




RIGGING PLAN




STANDARD RUDDER




SAIL PLAN



PLAN VIEW




BEACHING RUDDER BLADE

ADDENDUM NO. 1

GRANDFATHER CLAUSE:

The rapid development of the CORONADO 15 Class has resulted in the existence of some boats with measurements or sail dimensions that do not conform to the class specifications. The initial measurements taken by the Association Measurer indicated the primary differences to be sail dimensions, rudder angle and shape, centerboard angle and shape, and mainsail batten spacing. The purpose of this clause is to grant special permission to boats manufactured prior to August 1968 to race with their originally provided equipment for a reasonable period of time even though this equipment may not satisfy the specifications. The following specific allowances were made and no other exceptions will be considered as part of this clause. These allowances will be acceptable until the equipment is broken and replaced, new equipment is purchased or until August 1973 whichever is sooner.

1. SAILS

Any major dimension (jib luff, jib foot, jib leech, jib midgirth, main leech and main midgirth) may exceed the dimensions in the specifications by no more than one (1) inch.

2. BATTENS


The mainsail battens do not need to be equally spaced.

3. RUDDER


The rudder angle and shape may be as originally provided by the manufacture.

4. CENTERBOARD


The centerboard angle and shape may be as originally provided by the manufacture.




US 195 Jib halyard adjustment
