




The Hampton is a hard chine, V-bottom centerboard sloop designed by Vincent J. Serio. She is a fast and able one-design class boat which planes easily and uses a trapeze for speed and stability. There are over 650 Hamptons, sailed principally on Chesapeake Bay, where there are active racing fleets at Hampton, Norfolk, Annapolis, Cambridge, Chestertown and St. Mary's City.

The Hampton features a modern rig with aluminum spar and midship traveler. The fiberglass Hampton combines the traditional beauty of mahogany in coamings and trim with the rugged durability of fiberglass, and provides the additional safety and convenience of self-bailing in the event of a capsize.





For small boat racing on the Chesapeake Bay, the Hampton Class is unparalleled because of the excellent caliber of competition, and the extensive participation in no less than 30 Hampton Class regattas scheduled each year on all parts of the Bay.

Of the 17 one-design classes sanctioned by Chesapeake Bay Yacht Racing Association, the Hampton over the years has consistently been the most active class. If you are interested in racing, join the class that races the most — the Hampton.

The Hampton Class consists of a very tightly knit group of sailors with a surprising number of husband and wife teams. Comraderie is the hallmark of the Hampton Class.
