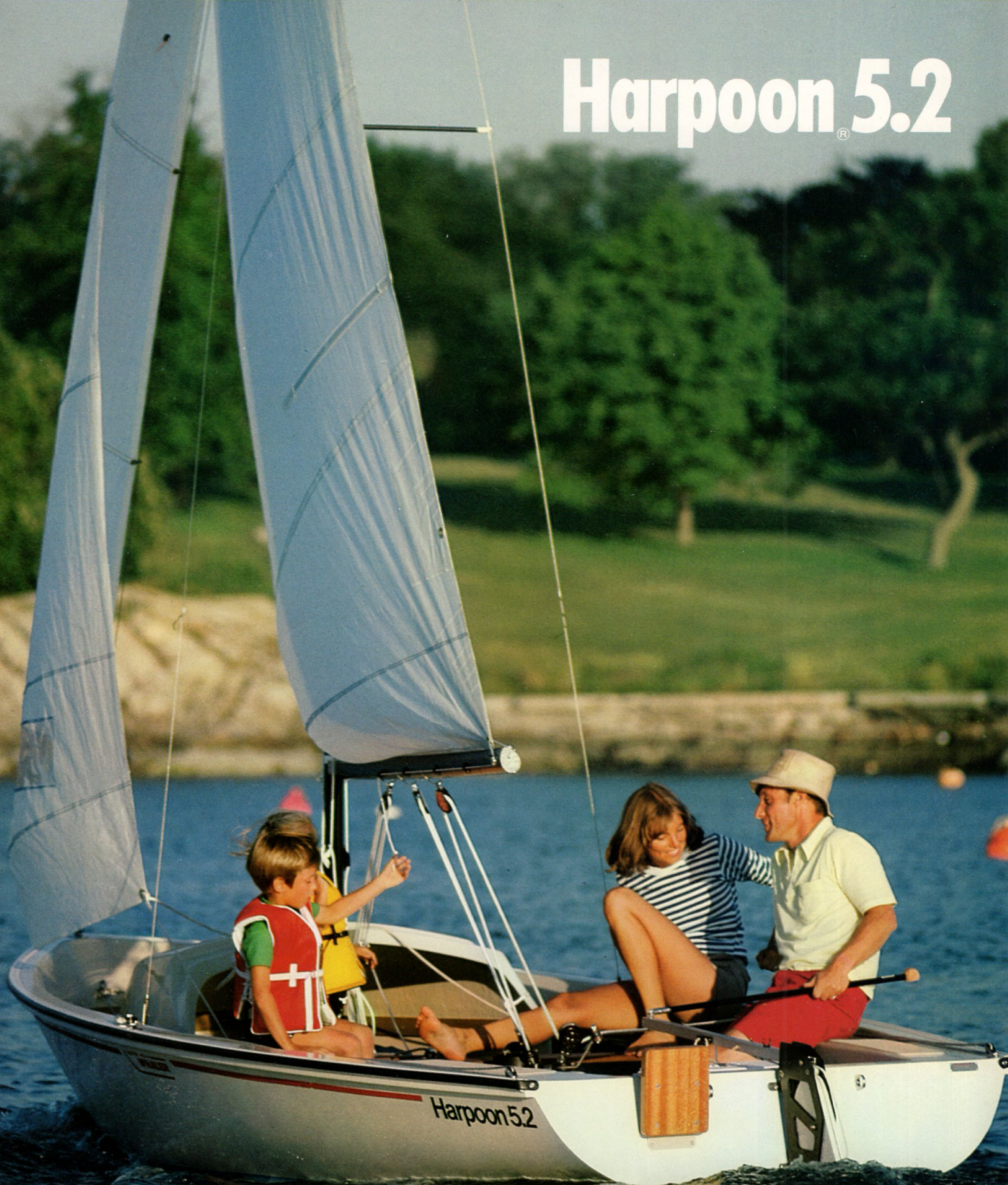

Day sailing vs. day cruising.

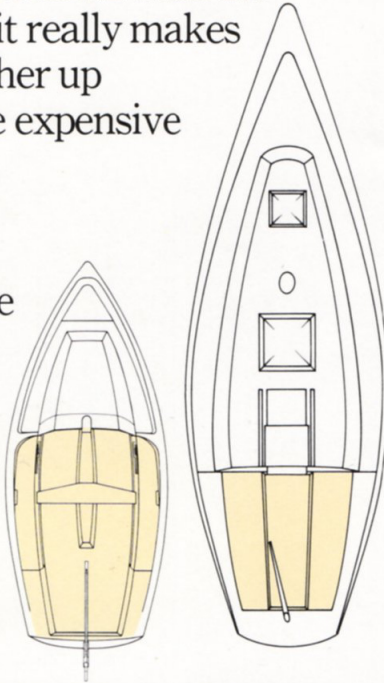

Her 7'6" beam gives Harpoon 5.2 incredible stability. Which makes her more sure-footed than any other sailboat her size.

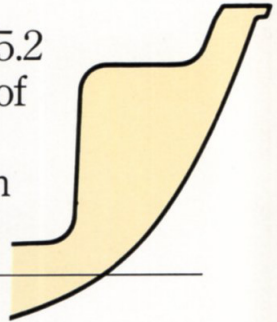

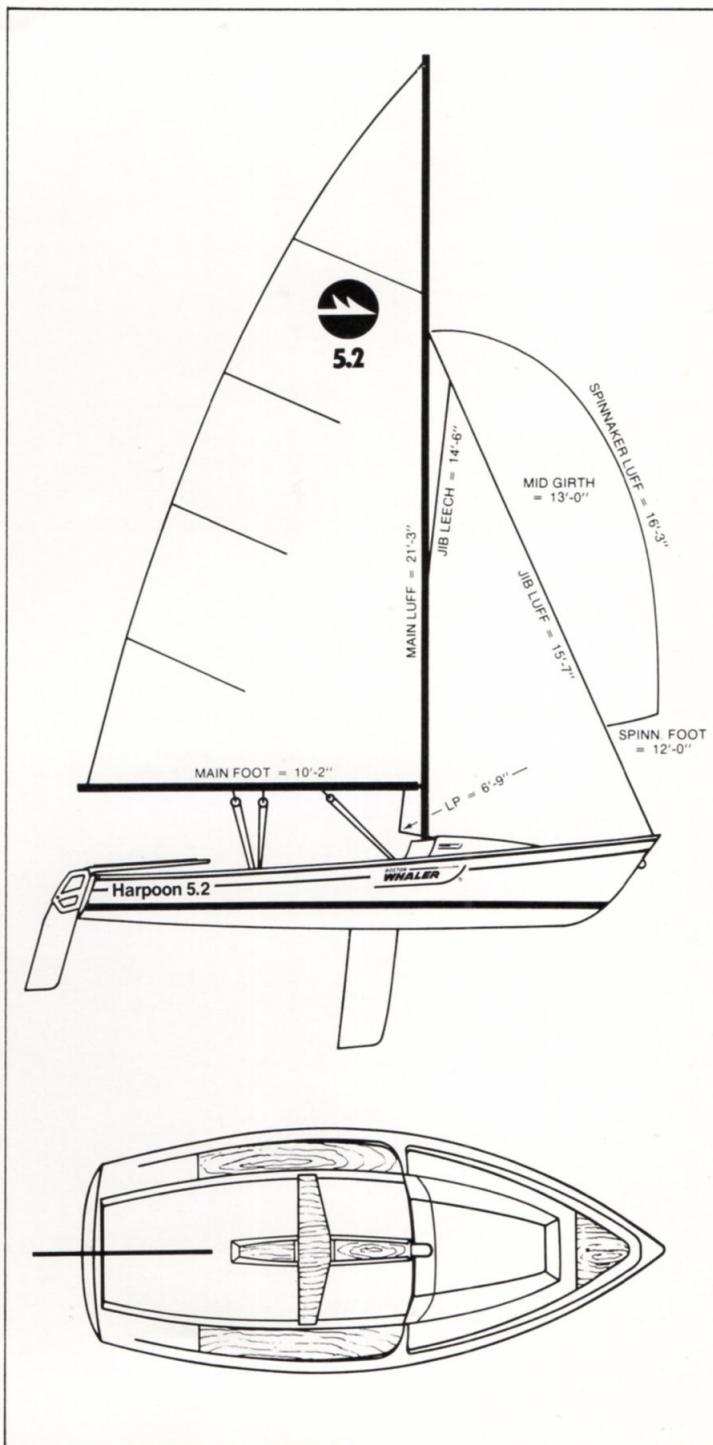

There isn't an easier boat to rig than Harpoon 5.2. Because the shrouds

are left attached, one person can do the entire job in about 15 minutes.

And Harpoon 5.2 is just as easy to trailer, launch and retrieve.



Mast rides securely on trailer and boom crutch.



Slip the mast onto Harpoon 5.2's hinged step pin.



Raise mast with jib halyard. Mount boom and launch.



Sturdy lifting eyes for hoisting.



Unique, molded-in skag helps align boat on trailer.
