The MiniSail is 13' of beautiful, easy to maintain glassfibre sailing fun designed to get you on to the water in minutes.



The **MiniSail** designed by Ian Proctor, M.S.I.A. for Richmond Marine Ltd., has won the silver medal at a Milan Triennale and has been selected for design display in twenty different countries. She's a real eye stopper but so simple to handle with the sail partially furled around the mast, a beginner can sail her. She's safe, too-unsinkable, and with internal foam flotation. If you are pressed for time you can get home from work and sail your MiniSail that evening – takes ten minutes to rig her and you're out sailing! No maintenance of the glassfibre hull or gold anodised aluminium spars – just wash the sail out once a year.

The MiniSail comes complete and ready to sail. You have a choice of deck and sail colour and these can be mixed or matched as required.

For the experienced helm, sailing single handed in a force 4, a sliding seat can be a great help. This is supplied complete as an optional accessory and is kept in place by simple clamps which fit under the deck flange.

We can supply you with an adjustable dinghy roof rack which fits almost any make of car.

1. Stern first, right way up, held down by the mainsheet with the spars alongside, on either a luggage rack or Richmond Marine's special two bar adjustable dinghy carrier.



3. Join together the mast, slide it into the sleeve in the luff of the sail and rotate the sail round the mast. Slip the burgee into the pocket in the top of the sail. At the water's edge step the mast and unfurl the sail. Clip the clew to the boom and tie the tack line.



2. At 120lbs hull weight the MiniSail is simple for a man and a girl to get on or off the roof of a car and is light enough to be carried single handed down the beach.



4. There are no shackles, no halliards, no wire rigging or bottle screws in the MiniSail. Once the sail is up just attach the mainsheet and kicking strap, instal the rudder and dagger board and your MiniSail is ready to sail.
