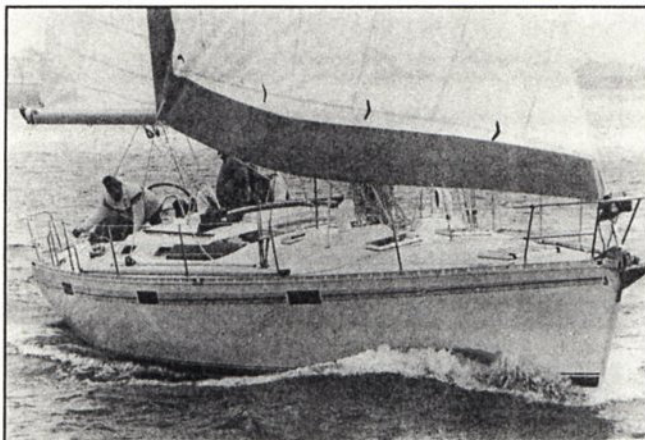


Oceanis 430

When cruising the local waterways or contemplating that extended cruise, the Oceanis 430 has an ease of handling that makes any sailing adventure a pure delight. In designing the Oceanis 430, Phillipe Briand has created a go-anywhere cruising yacht uninhibited by the number of crew.

Featuring roller-furling headsails, self-tailing winches, and single-line reefing, the deck layout is the result of years of research and development. Wide, open side decks allow easy movement around the deck or that uncluttered space for laying around when the cruise is over.



Anchor rollers forward and aft and roller fairleads allow for easy docking or mooring, regardless of the conditions.

The Oceanis 430 is not only functional, but the stylish flair of Briand is evident in the sleek hull and deck lines.

The cockpit is large and manageable with the coach-house traveler allowing enough excess room for a pedestal table. Belowdecks, the Oceanis 430 is elegantly lit by the full deck port light and integral hull ports. The excess of light highlights the quality joinery work synonymous with Beneteau while privacy can be obtained by the sliding blinds.

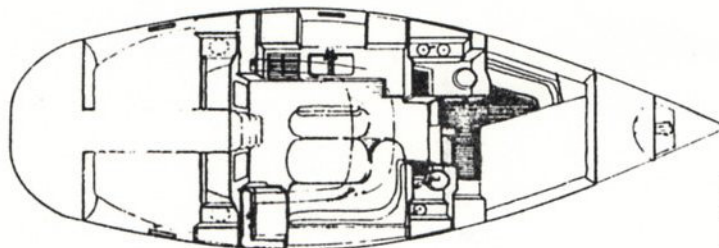
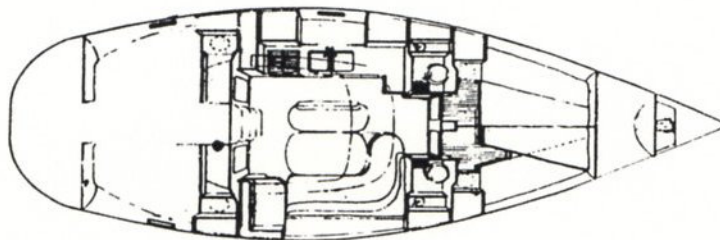
