The WYLIECAT 17 was conceived as a small, affordable, high performance sailboat that can be used by many different types of sailors, i.e. family sailing, Jr. programs, local racing fleets. The "17" was designed with five key criteria in mind: safety, speed, simplicity, affordability and fun. This boat has features only found on much more expensive sport boats, such as a lifting leaded bulb keel, cassette rudder and carbon fiber mast, bringing daysailing into the 1990's.

The WYLIECAT 17 was designed by Thomas Wylie, one of the country's leading boat designers, and built by master craftsman, Ron Moore, of Moore Sailboats in Santa Cruz, CA. This boat offers the latest in "go fast" design, coupled with modern construction techniques.

An unstayed, tapered, carbon fiber mast, built by Composite Engineering, carries a 195 square foot sail, with an aluminum "windsurfer style" wishbone. This fully battened sail sports a large viewing window, as well as the colorful Wyliecat graphics. The secret to this rig's design is the amount of flex in its 26' spar. This mast is designed to bend two to

three times the amount of a traditional carbon fiber mast, allowing the top of the sail to “depower” as the wind increases, resulting in a self-reefing system.

The WYLINECAT 17's large, ten foot cockpit was designed to be sat in, rather than sat on, however hiking on its rounded side decks is quite comfortable. This cockpit can accommodate three adults, however it can also easily be sailed by just one. Weighing under 400 pounds, the 17 was designed to be sailed with a crew ranging from 150 to 550 pounds. The boat's vacuum-bagged, unidirectional E-glass hull is fully cored with balsa to give it strength and dent resistance. Its water-tight compartments give this boat an extra level of safety, as well as positive floatation, making this boat one of the safest on the water. The WYLINECAT 17...a rig so advanced it's simple.

The Wyliecat 30 is the greatest Bay boat that's ever been built, because it's so easy to handle a wide range of wind conditions. When a puff hits, she heels gradually and never ends up on her ear. There aren't a million lines for the kids to get caught in during tacks and I feel safe with my family onboard.
